PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

This APFACTS new sletter comes at the end of a school term which has seen substantial school education developments both nationally and in the ACT.

At the national level we saw alarming data emerge a month ago, about a potential reduction in recurrent funding for the majority of non-government schools in the ACT.

Very soon after, the Federal Government led by the Prime Minister assured that the Government's plans for implementing (most of) the recommendations of the Gonski Review would see no school lose funding rather gain funding through a plan for school improvement.

This was a substantial and positive development. The implementation timetable announced by the Prime Minister is to commence in 2014 and will take a further 13 years to fully implement. We continue to work withthe ACT Government and stakeholders in advocating for transparency as to the funding model and implementation timetable that will be used in the ACT.

Recent developments in NSW has seen a 3% reduction in school funding for non-government schools in NSW as well as an indexation freeze for 4 years. This move will also see new students entering non-government schools receive no funding for the four year period.

It is hard to believe in a time where we are talking about the investment needed to implement Gonski and school improvement that the NSW government has taken this approach. Despite these alarming funding cuts in NSW, the ACT still remains the low est funded non-government schools nationally at 17.5% compared with 22% in NSW and 27% in WA.

As our local election approaches here in the ACT, education is emerging as a major election issue with political parties developing and announcing a range of initiatives, a number of which specifically recognising the importance of non-government schools in the ACT. I urge you to consider the initiatives and pledges made so far as well as possible additional initiatives which may be announced closer to the ACT Election on October 20, 2012.

APFACTS has been active in representing non-government school parent perspectives through the news media and advocating our position directly to ACT political leaders, through an election forum for parents to hear and consider each parties election policies and pledges, and through e-bulletins to affiliates and schools.

ACT ELECTION PLEDGES

Australian Labor Party (ACT Branch)

Policy Platform 2011-2012

- Pledge on September 17, 2012: Student focussed centre and increased Secondary Bursary Scheme. \$1.7 million for a student-focused Mt Stromlo Science Centre and Planetarium, to provide opportunities for students to connect to maths and science. The existing Secondary Bursary Scheme will be increased from \$500 to \$750 per student, per year to assist with the purchase of hand held or tablet devices. More
- Pledge on September 9, 2012: Recurrent funding for students most in need in the non government sector. \$11 million dollars to support non-government students with a disability, Indigenous students, low SES background and low level English proficiency. \$5 million to support nongovernment preschool students, based on need. More
- Pledge on September 5, 2012: Preschool Matters
 program. \$400,000 for a Preschool Matters program to provide
 support and further engage parents in their kids' education and
 their school community. More
- Pledge on August 27, 2012: ACT Healthy Kids. \$500,000
 available in grants over four years to establish a fund for all
 schools w ho agree to phase out the sale of sugary drinks. More
- Pledge on July 28, 2012: Smart School, Smart Students grant program for non-government schools. \$2.5 million in grants to non-government schools introduced over the next four years at \$625,000 p/annum to help fund or subsidise the installation of fast broadband infrastructure in the ACT. More

 Pledge on September 14, 2012: Increase to non government school funding to 25%. Also student wellbeing, addressing bullying in schools and increasing numeracy and literacy. More

• Pledge on September 22: \$1.5 million dollars to build a school

dedicated to young children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). The school will cater for 40 students aged between two and six years old. A further \$1 million dollars p/an to operate the school. More

- Pledge on August 31, 2012: Increase to non-government school funding to 25%. \$31.4 million over the forward estimates to increase non-government school funding to bring the ACT on par with other State funding levels. More
- Pledge in July, 2012: Safer School Zones for all Canberra Schools. \$6.8 million to provide every school in the ACT with flashing school zone signs over next four years with priority of rollout to schools with significant crashand speeding history, busy traffic flows and higher speed limits. More

- Pledge on September 12, 2012: Grants to establish school gardens and improve canteens + legislation to protect children from junk food advertising. Grants for school gardens and improvements to school canteeens. Legislation to protect children from junk food advertising in prime time TV, Cinema and bus shelter advertising and recruitment of staffer to implement legislative change. More
- Pledge on September 4, 2012: Care and Protection for young people. \$2.7 million plan to boost training and support for people w ho are directly involved in the lives of young people in the care system. More
